2020 Overview

Section Foreman House (See Photo A)

- Performed preservation work on the SFH to mitigate any future damage to the SFH, especially during the winter, until there is a future reuse plan put into action
 - New History completed a structural assessment of the SFH and put together a comprehensive report
 - SFH was designated by the City Council as a Wayzata Heritage Preservation Site
 - Work was completed and is currently ongoing to place the SFH on the National Register Nomination

- The HPB took pictures of various houses prior to demolition for the City's records.
 - The Centennial Awards were reviewed, but the records showed that no houses passed the 100 year mark in 2020. (this award is for houses that have been standing for 100 years).
 - The 2020 Mayor's Award (last one by Mayor Wilcox) was given to the Wayzata State Bank on Lake Street. The owner (Lowell Zitzloff) completed an enormous task by preserving the column architecture of the Bank that has been in Wayzata for many years. **(See Photo B)**
